

9 STÜHLE - LETTERBOX

(placed on 16.11. 2003 by Fam. Groß)



- Start: Parking lot at the Billesweier between Enkenbach/Alsenborn and Neuheimsbach at L 395. District Kaiserslautern.
- Length: approx. 1,5 hours (depending upon way choice)
- Difficulty: easy means
- Recommended topographic map "Enkenbach Alsenborn; Hochspeyer P5 1:25.000 "



HISTORY

The stump forest area between the three villages Neuheimsbach, Alsenborn and Ramsen seemed to our former ancestors for the application suitably of court places than particularly. It is not a miracle, Someone scoffs spoke there of the "triangle of the justice ". On the right of the road when fount - Randeckerhof - Neuheimsbach (20 way minutes northeast from the Billesweiher and/or from the Randecker farm) was on the Schelmenkopf the regional court on the Stampe, the stump forest court of "nine chairs" - like it was later called. While we have to do it with this court with one of the three imperial regional courts in the Wormsgau, the high court was on the Hallau (some dozen of steps of the Billesweiher on the left of the aforementioned road) the Galgen for the demonstration of the high jurisdiction of the rule Neuheimsbach.



CLUE

From the parking lot, direction road the way between lake and road toward the other sea-side follow. From here follow the moving marking (greener and blue line). After approx. 20 minutes reaches one the stump forest court.

Count the "E" on the monument the "Gemeinde Alsenborn" Und note you the number.



In the text ____ E are contained!!

Note you also the year: _ _ _ _

Now place you behind "MERTESHEIM" and look over "COLGENSTEIN" your view falls on a beech!

From this beech you see a further beech with 170° (with moving markings - white cross and a 3 ,14 and a E5 etc..)

From here you follow the way, which number of steps you get if you the number of "E" by the number of chairs multiply, and which result divides by two. (around your step size to examine you can take the checksum of the year + to 2, now would have you with the first beech to be!!But this beech are without meaning!!!!)

Then you come again to a beech, on the back of this beech find you a cross.

From here from 265° and X steps and you find hidden between three coniferous trees the " NEUN STÜHLE - LETTERBOX " under old Wood trunks .

$X = \text{checksum (the year of the stone)} + \text{checksum} + 12$

Take care of other hikers!

Stamp and hide the box as you have found it, best covered by the heavy wedge-shaped stone.
